Genetic disorders can be caused by a mutation in one gene (monogenic disorder), by mutations in multiple genes (multifactorial inheritance disorder), by a combination of gene mutations and environmental factors, or by damage to chromosomes (changes in the number or structure of entire chromosomes, the structures that carry genes).

What do dwarfism, color blindness, and cystic fibrosis all have in common? These examples are just a few of many human disorders caused by a mutation in a single gene. To produce an individual with the disorder, a mutation must be present in the cells that produce gametes. These germ line mutations are then transmitted from parent to offspring. Some germ line mutations appear spontaneously, but many are inherited from a parent who already carries the mutant allele in their genome.

Abnormalities in an individual's genetic makeup cause genetic disease. A genetic disease is any disease caused by an abnormality in the genetic makeup of an individual. The genetic abnormality can range from minuscule to major -- from a discrete mutation in a single base in the DNA of a single gene to a gross

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chromosomal abnormality involving the addition or subtraction of an entire chromosome or set of chromosomes.

Genetic Advantages Disorders such as sickle cell disease and CF are still common in human populations. In the United States, the sickle cell allele is carried by approximately 1 person in 12 of African ancestry, and the CF allele is carried by roughly 1 person in 25 of European ancestry.

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
